


The Stennis Institute (SI) at Mississippi State University (MSU) appreciates your community's interest in applying for the First Impressions initiative (FI). The following application packet will provide insight into the program and outline the basic requirements needed to be successful as a host community.

FI Overview:

FI is based on the belief that a community's appearance and "friendliness" has a direct impact on its economic well-being. The program allows a community to see itself through the eyes of a visitor and provides the opportunity for community residents to make a visual impact on their community's appearance and lead to greater economic vitality. As part of the FI program, a team of volunteer visitors will explore various areas of your community and evaluate appearances, access to services, friendliness, and other community attributes. Results of the visit will be summarized and presented during a community presentation. Following the presentation, a local action team will design and implement a community improvement project that enhances the community's appearance and overall quality of life.

FI Process and Timeline:



Once a community has expressed an interest in participating in the FI program, SI staff will discuss the program and clarify any expectations. SI staff will also discuss the FI application and the need to form a local action team as part of the program. Once an application is received, SI staff will work with the applicant and the local action team to schedule the FI events. These events include a site visit, a community presentation of the results, and a project mapping workshop.









Community Expectations:

As part of the FI program, local communities will:

- Identify a sponsoring group and lead contact person for your community.
- Form a local action team representing a cross-section of the community.
- Participate in a preliminary meeting to outline the program and various responsibilities.
- The local action team will help prepare for a community meeting to share the results of the visiting team, including arranging all logistics, inviting residents to participate in the community meeting, and ensuring room set up.
- The local action team will participate in a half-day project mapping workshop where team members will identify and design a local improvement project to be implemented within the community.
- Members of the local action should be willing to potenially serve on a visiting team to another community
 participating in the First Impressions program.

Program Costs and Deliverables:

- All communities will receive a summary report that highlights:
 - The general impressions and observations noted by the visiting team.
 - A pdf copy of the community presentation.
 - A Project Mapping summary that outlines the local improvement project identified and short-term implementation steps developed.
 - An electronic copy of all photos taken during the team visit.
- The costs associated with the delivery of the FI program vary, depending on the size of the community. For additional information regarding current FI fees, please contact the Stennis Institute.
